## 1 Samuel 3-4

Why might David have snuck into camp if not to kill Saul?

Who is Abner, and how is he related to Saul (1 Sam. 14:50)?

Why does David continually preserve Saul? Is this appropriate?

### David With the Philistines

What happened the last time David dwelt in Gath?

What does David request of Achish, and why?

How does David lie to Achish? What is Achish's response to it?

### APPLICATIONS:

1. *Blessed is your advice and blessed are you*

What lessons of wisdom can we learn from Abigail?

**1 Samuel 28-30**

**War Against Philistia**

What position did David hold with the king of the Philistines?

Why was Saul afraid?

What was Saul's response to God not speaking to him?

Why might the witch have recognized Saul when she saw Samuel?

**David is Removed From Philistia**

Where was David and his army in the order of battle?

Why did the Philistine lords object to David?

Why does David continually preserve Saul? Is this appropriate?

**David Against the Amalekites**

Why would there still be Amalekites after Saul defeated them?

Why is it important to see David inquire of God in this situation?

Why does David share the spoils with the men who were unable to fight? With the elders of Judah?

**APPLICATIONS:**

1. *Bring up Samuel for me*

There is a great debate as to whether this was Samuel or a deceiving spirit of some sort. What is important is to understand the dangers of the occult. Why is God opposed to such things?

**1 Samuel 31 – 2 Samuel 1**

**Death of Saul**

How old might Saul be at this time (i.e. at least \_\_\_\_\_)?

Who were the first to die in battle against the Philistines?

How was Saul wounded?

Why did Saul want his armor bearer to kill him?

Why would the Philistines abuse the body of Saul and his sons?

Why would the men of Jabesh risk their lives to recover Saul's body? Why burn the bodies?

**David Learns of Saul's Death**

How did the man from Saul's camp know what happened to Saul?

Why would David mourn for the death of Saul?

Where was the man who found Saul from?

1 Samuel 31 says Saul fell on his own sword; the Amalekite says that he killed Saul. How do we reconcile this?

What do we know about the *Book of Jasher*?

What does David praise about Saul? What praise about Jonathan

**APPLICATIONS:**

**1. *I have killed the LORD'S anointed***

These chapters give us one of the few examples in the Bible of suicide and the only account of an assisted suicide. What does David's pronouncement reveal about God's law? What does this event reveal about suicide in general?

## 2 Samuel 2-4

### David, King of Judah

- Why might God send David to Hebron?

- Who was made king in place of Saul by Abner?

### Abner, Asahel and Joab

- Why did the soldiers of Joab and Abner come together?
- What was the purpose of the competition?

- Who are David's wives to this point?
- Why was Abner accused of going to Saul's concubine?
- Why was Abner angry? What did he do?
- What deal does Abner make with David?

- What does David declare about Joab?

### Ishbosheth's End

- Why might Ishbosheth lose heart over Abner's death?
- Why would men of Benjamin murder Ishbosheth?
- Why bring the head of Ishbosheth to David?
- Why does David respond as he does?

### APPLICATIONS:

#### 1. *"My kingdom and I are guiltless"*

- Joab's murder of Abner is a testimony of the personality of Joab. What characteristics can you describe in Joab that we have seen in the books of 1 and 2 Samuel?

(1 Chronicles 11-12)**

**David King of Israel**

- Why do the people of Israel finally submit to David?
- How old was David when he became King in Judah? In Israel?
- What were some of the old/other names of Jerusalem?
- Does David really hate the blind and lame (2 Samuel 9)?
- Why might the King of Tyre build David's palace?
- How did David "know" God was with him?
- Why did the Philistines seek out David?
- How did David defeat the Philistines and drive them back?

**Moving the Ark to Jerusalem**
