


Matthew 5:17-20

Jesus said he came not to destroy the law, but fulfill. Later, Paul would say that Jesus did abolish the law: Ephesians 2:15 having abolished in His flesh the enmity, that is, the law of commandments contained in ordinances, so as to create in Himself one new man from the two, thus making peace,




There are three ways Jesus came to "fulfill" the Law and Prophets:
First, he fulfilled the prophecies regarding him in both the law of Moses and the prophets (Matt 1:22, et al)

Second, he filled the void that the law made (Romans 8:3, Galatians 3:21)

Finally, this lesson sees that he met with the "law" and "the prophets", and they submitted to him




Peter says the testimony of Christ was made evident to him at the Mt. of Transfiguration




Elijah is important to NT doctrine




Moses is important to NT doctrine




The bodies of each of these three cannot be found today


Each of these men were prophesied to return (two in form, one in the flesh)




The unique 40 day fast



The Purpose of the Old Testament

To bring us to Christ

Therefore the law was our tutor to bring us to Christ, that we might be justified by faith. But after faith has come, we are no longer under a tutor.

The Purpose of the Old Testament

"Abraham said to him, 'They have Moses and the prophets; let them hear them.' And he said, 'No, father Abraham; but if one goes to them from the dead, they will repent.' But he said to him, 'If they do not hear Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded though one rise from the dead.'" Luke 16:29-31
